The following section consists of data collected for youth who were active as of January 31, 2007, and reflects their **status at intake** in various life domains. Of these youth, 43 % were African American and most (80%) were male. Thirty-three percent were displaying severe truancy behavior at school and 30% percent were not attending at all. Seventy-seven percent had been in CPTP between 0-3 months.

Unsupervised during non-school hours 75% or more of the time (N=29)	97%

Discharges:

Since program inception, the majority of youth discharged because they graduated/met all CPTP requirements (41%) or returned to WET center/warrant issued (41%). Eleven percent discharged because they were arrested for a new offense.
